Coalition of DC Education and Equity Advocates to Release Open Letter to Mayor Bowser and City Council on the Search For a New DCPS Chancellor and Deputy Mayor for Education

WASHINGTON- A diverse group of education and equity focused organizations along with individuals from all eight wards are holding a press conference this Thursday June 28, 2018 at 10:00 am to release a letter to Mayor Bowser and the DC City Council calling for an open and inclusive process in selecting a new DCPS Chancellor and Deputy Mayor for Education. Mayor Bowser announced that the searches would begin following the June 19h primary and the D.C. community is prepared to engage in an open dialogue about where we are more than ten years after major education reforms changed the landscape of DC education. While progress has been made in many areas, there is much room for improvement. For that reason, this diverse coalition is outlining a positive, forward-looking agenda for DC schools and looks forward to engaging with the Mayor and City Council on how this search process can begin that important conversation.
